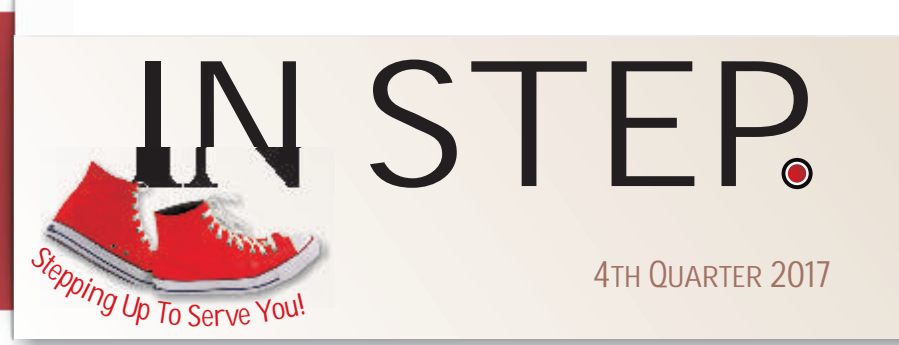

NOVEMBER IS EPILEPSY AWARENESS MONTH



Seize the Day 5K Kansas City November 5, 2017

My sister recently gave birth to my beautiful and innocent looking niece, Frankie May. While alone with my sister in hospital her room, I knew I wouldn't be able to hold little Frankie without another person being there because I never know when I may have a seizure. However, I know many women with epilepsy who have children, have healthy and happy families with lot of planning. Of the things people pray for when their child is born, is that they are healthy. According to the Centers for Disease Control Prevention, "more than 467,000 children have been diagnosed with epilepsy and almost 150,000 people in the US develop this disorder of the central nervous system.



While there is not a cure for epilepsy, it can be treated in several ways. Medication, special diets and multiple types of surgeries are ways used to control seizures. I have been on at least a dozen medications along with 5 surgeries in the past 35 years. Sadly I am not seizure free, but my seizures have gotten smaller over the years. The stress from not being able to drive to the store, participate in social activities, to facing discrimination and challenges with employment, causes the majority of people suffering from epilepsy to experience depression, anxiety and even attempt suicide.

The famous painter Vincent Van Gough had epilepsy, along with President Theodore Roosevelt, Emmy nominated actor Danny Glover and professional football player Jason Snelling. Rick

Harrison of the reality TV show Pawn Stars shared his story about having epilepsy during the National Walk for Epilepsy held in Washington, DC several years ago. Rick was named a national spokesperson by the Epilepsy Foundation for his advocacy and to create awareness for the disease.

I love being an advocate for Epilepsy. Whether sharing my story of having epilepsy to a group of people or meeting with a Senator to discuss a bill regarding insurance covering medication. I would never be the person I am today without others who have shared their story with me, without family, friends and organizations like the Epilepsy Foundation of Missouri and Kansas.
